'Everything starts with curiosity'

On 12, 13 and 19 October, some 600 first-year social work students from Hogeschool Rotterdam had the opportunity to meet new citizens during four sessions. Mohammed Ali, Johanna Aguillon and Ishmail Kamara took the students on their journey from their home countries to here. What was their childhood like? What did they experience? Why did they have to leave their country? Workshops were organized by Saskia Möhlmann and led by Esseline van de Sande in StoryHouse Belvédère, a house full of stories and heritage.

Thus, themes such as courage, meaningful relationships, having family miles apart and about the image of 'the refugee' were addressed. What can these aspiring social workers do for the new citizens? The diversity of students makes Ishmail hopeful for the future. "Such a diverse group is good for an inclusive society."

During the meeting between the students and the storytellers, you could sense a change. "The students entered the conversation relaxed but cautious, throughout the session this grew into surprise and interest," Johanna said. Her message to the future social workers was to use someone's name, the most beautiful word in the world is your name. It makes someone a person and not just a number.
